

## International Conference on the Future of Agricultural Biodiversity

## 23 May 2019 - Hotel Erzsébet Királyné, Gödöllő, HUNGARY

Biodiversity of agricultural landscapes - both natural and cultivated - has been dramatically declining in the last decades. Recent reports of international organizations, based on scientific research, clearly predict the disappearance of certain species in the very close future, and as a consequence, forecast the imbalance/shocks of our food systems and well-being, already in the medium term. These changes also affect Hungary: nowadays not only the researchers, but also people who are attentive to nature, feel the worrying tendencies: the decline of the well-known birds and small game species, the disappearance of pollinating insects.

- What are the main causes of the loss of agricultural biodiversity?
- To what extent industrial agricultural practices can be blamed for the disappearance of certain species?
- What is the role of CAP in the unfavourable processes of recent decades?
- What can we do if anything to ensure that our children enjoy the wonders of nature and have access to all its benefits without giving up the well-being of the western World?

At the conference organized by MME/BirdLife Hungary in the frame of the project "Cross-Border Protection of the Great Bustard in Central Europe - LIFE15 NAT / AT000834" the key actors of the agricultural and nature conservation sectors will jointly analyse the process, assess their role and outline future trends.
